

COMMENCEMENT

Students who have met the requirements for graduation will be allowed to participate in the commencement proceedings provided they abide by the proceedings organized by the school district. It is the responsibility of the principal to solicit input from each graduating class regarding the proceedings for their commencement.

Students who have not met the graduation requirements are not eligible to participate in the ceremony. However, the superintendent may waive these provisions for a student who has not met the requirements, upon satisfactory evidence that the student will complete the coursework within a brief time, or for a student who is experiencing or has experienced special and unusual circumstances, such as a serious illness.

A student may be withheld from commencement ceremonies for misconduct occurring prior to graduation.

Failure of a student to participate in commencement will not cause the student's diploma or transcripts to be withheld if all academic graduation requirements have been met.
