Things to Keep in Mind

- For college courses there will be an expectation to know the following:
 - APA writing/citation style
 - MLA writing/citation style
- Dual credit courses **DO** count towards your high school GPA
- If you get a D and/or F in a college course, it **WILL** affect your eligibility
- College courses are time consuming; expect to work on them **OUTSIDE** of school
- If you have a poor performance in a college course, you are put on a semester probation before being allowed to take another one
- Time management skills and a high level of self-motivation will be a must in order to be successful in these courses
