Chapter 11 Paper Topic: Gender Roles in Media

As you have learned, **gender roles** are the societal expectations of what a man/woman should be; not necessarily who they are. This paper will focus on how gender roles are displayed in the media, meaning do they follow the "normal" format or would the characters be perceived as abnormal.

For this paper, you get to watch your favorite movie or television show. However, you aren't necessarily viewing for leisure. Rather, you are attempting to observe the male and female gender roles being played out on screen. You can focus on the main characters, but I would like a profile on at least one male and one female on the program.

An example would be one of my favorite television shows from high school, <u>Buffy the Vampire Slayer</u>. This particular show happens to break the traditional expectations of gender roles: Buffy is a strong willed, independent thinker who happens to physically manhandle supernatural beings day in and day out. Her friend Xander, however, is not exactly the most capable man at fighting and is more of the support system for Buffy and her friends. These would be "abnormal" gender roles according to what society thinks men and women should be.

A different example would be if I examined <u>Varsity Blues</u>. Darcy is a stereotypical cheerleader, dresses provocatively and is dependent on local quarterbacks to get her out of her small town. Mox is the independent thinker who still plays football while standing up against his coach, embracing typical masculinity. These would be "normal" gender roles.
